The 2010 award will be presented at the annual Brotherhood/Sisterhood Citation Award Dinner on **Wednesday, November 17, 2010**, at the Koury Convention Center in Greensboro, North Carolina.

NCCJ's Nominee Selection Committee will meet to consider all nominations. In June 2010, NCCJ's Board of Directors will select the Honoree from the nominees presented to them.

**Please read carefully. NCCJ's vision is to build a community free of bias, bigotry and racism. NCCJ does not advocate for any particular group or philosophy, but works to build mutual respect among all people—regardless of race, culture, sexual orientation, gender, socioeconomic background, or faith. Citation Award nominees must model these values in all aspects of their lives.**

### Eligibility

Anyone who is a resident of the Piedmont Triad is eligible for nomination as a possible honoree. The following provisions and exclusions apply:

- 1) The nominee may not have previously been an honoree of the Piedmont Triad;
- 2) If a nominee has been honored with the Citation Award in another community, only his/her work in the Piedmont Triad will be considered for this award;
- 3) The nominee may not hold elective office *except* in cases when the individual's term will be completed within the year, he/she has not filed for any elective office, and filing deadlines have closed; and
- 4) Current NCCJ Board members are generally not eligible for the Citation Award; however, in special circumstances, the Selection Committee may accept nominations of current Board members. Emeritus NCCJ Board members are eligible for the Citation Award.
