More about STARR: STARR is solely focused on race and racism and their history and past and current manifestations in the context of the United States. We thought it was important to focus on this topic due to current events as students engage in race conversations more and more.

We will be talking about topics like privilege, cultural appropriation, activism, leadership and we'll even be visiting the Civil Rights Museum in Greensboro to learn about the Civil Rights Movement in our city! Students will also have a chance to connect with other program participants through small groups and conversation.

NOTE #1: The cost is \$100 to attend. We offer generous need-based tuition assistance on a sliding scale. Just request tuition assistance when you fill out the application.

NOTE#2: Students will be required to wear a mask inside the Union Square Building at all times per their regulations. See below for more details on COVID-related safety measures.

COVID-Related Safety Measures

- Students and staff will be required to wear a mask inside the Union Square Building at all times per their regulations.
- Students are not required to wear a mask outside of social distance (6ft) can be maintained. If it cannot, they are required to wear a mask.
- We encourage you to bring your own mask but we also will supply students with disposable masks if they do not have one.
- Each morning, staff members will take students' temperatures with an infrared forehead thermometer.
- There will be hand sanitizer stations throughout the Union Square Building for students to use freely and facility staff will be cleaning every room after each use.
- Each student will be given a pool noodle upon arrival that they will use in order to maintain social distance when engaging in group work.
- Each student will be given their own bag of materials they will use throughout the week to avoid sharing things like pens and markers.

We ask that you help us protect the health of staff and delegates of STARR. Anyone who is sick or was sick with COVID-19 or recently in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the last 14 days – including staff, campers, delegates, and families – should not come to STARR. Be on the lookout for symptoms of COVID-19, which include fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, and loss of taste or smell. Call your doctor if you think you or a family member is sick.
